This order is made under section 53 of the Trade in Endangered Species Act 1989 on the advice and with the consent of the Executive Council.

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Order

1 Title

This order is the Trade in Endangered Species Order 2026.

2 Commencement

- (1) This order comes into force on 5 March 2026.

- (2) However, clause 5 comes into force on 5 June 2027.

3 Principal Act

This order amends the Trade in Endangered Species Act 1989.

4 Schedules 1, 2, and 3 replaced

Explanatory note

This note is not part of the order but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order updates the schedules of the Trade in Endangered Species Act 1989 (the **Act**) that list endangered, threatened, and exploited species. The changes align the schedules with changes that have been made to the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (the **Convention**).

Most of the changes come into force on 5 March 2026. *Clause 5*, which amends Schedule 2 of the Act, as replaced by *clause 4*, comes into force on 5 June 2027. The timing of these changes depends on when the related changes to the Convention take effect.
